

DAVID MCGOWAN

Professor David McGowan teaches and writes in various fields, including antitrust, copyright, contracts, corporations, securities regulation, professional responsibility, and freedom of expression. His current research involves the regulation of digital content, including open-source software, website access, the relationship between copyright and freedom of speech, legal incentives for lawyer disclosure of client financial misconduct, the relationship between the economic theory of the firm and lawyer representation of entity clients, and the reliance interest in legal ethics.

Before joining the University of Minnesota Law School faculty, Professor McGowan practiced law in San Francisco with the firms of Skadden, Arps, Slate, Meagher & Flom and Howard, Rice, Nemerovski, Canady, Falk & Rabkin, where he became a Director in 1998. Before entering practice, Professor McGowan was a law clerk to the Hon. A. Raymond Randolph of the Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit. He received his B.A. *magna cum laude* from the University of California at Los Angeles in 1986, and his J.D. from the Boalt Hall School of Law in 1990. At Boalt, he was a member of the Order of the Coif and an associate editor of the *California Law Review*. Between 1995 and 1998, Professor McGowan was a lecturer at Boalt. He joined the University of Minnesota Law School faculty in 1998. He is currently a visiting professor at the University of San Diego Law School.
