Style Guide

General Guidelines:

- 12-18 pages (total), 12pt font, double spaced, with 1in margins

Abstract:

Each submission should include an abstract consisting of no more than 300 words and generally adhering to the following format. Note: text contained in visualizations does not count toward the word limit.

- key aspects of the literature review
- problem under investigation or research question(s)
- clearly stated hypothesis or hypotheses
- methods used (including brief descriptions of the study design, sample, and sample size)
- study results
- implications (i.e., why this study is important, applications of the results or findings)

Title page:

Include a title page containing the main title and subtitle (if applicable) centered on the page, followed by the authors names (anonymized for the initial submission) and institutional affiliation. To anonymize your submission, make sure you replace every occurrence of your name or names with “Author/Authors”.

Additional Formatting:

As this publication is meant to serve a wide variety of students, we have purposefully allowed for both APA and MLA formats. And as *Working Papers in Language and Linguistics* is meant to support students in their efforts to pursue professional and academic publications, allowing submissions in both formats will make it easier for students in both departments to then transition to submitting to journals in their respective fields.

With that said, for formatting purposes **we ask that all authors use footnotes, not endnotes.**
